## Luftwaffe Pilot's Badge 1936-45 – Zinc Version "BSW" Bruder Schneider AG, Wien

## **Description**

All active military personnel qualifying for the military Pilot's License received the Pilot's Badge to be worn on the left breast pocket of the uniform jacket. There is some controversy as to the institution date of the Pilot's Badge. Dr. Heinrich Doehle has determined it to be 26<sup>th</sup> March 1936. The first reference to the Pilot's Badge was made on 27<sup>th</sup> May 1935.

## Remarks

This Zinc version of the BSW Pilot's badge has roots back into 1943. It is thus untrue to classify this Zinc version as strictly "late" war as is the usual case with zinc made badges. The BSW pilots badges had the distinctive characteristic being the talon on the eagles right foot touching the Swastika forming a "bridge". This is usually an indicator of an original period piece.
